This international and interdisciplinary workshop expands on recent discoveries and new theorizations of the role of early Pythagorean number theory and music theory in fields including: classical architecture; Hellenistic music theory and practice; Hellenistic and medieval Platonism; Renaissance music; Renaissance painting; and early modern astronomy and mathematics. Our trans-historical investigation of the connections between new insights from these diverse disciplines and time periods will transcend disciplinary boundaries and cross the divide between the humanities and the exact sciences.

October 22-24:

Forms and Transformations of Pythagorean Knowledge: Askēsis – Religion – Science

Conference at Freie Universität, Seminarzentrum Otto-von-Simson-Str. 26, Berlin-Dahlem

This conference aims to address the connections between the different forms of Pythagorean knowledge. In particular, we intend to discuss how <code>askēsis</code>, practical training and/or exercise concerning the Pythagorean way of life, was related to more doctrinal fields of knowledge such as Pythagorean religion and science. Papers will explore the effects of such interdependencies of knowledge both within the Pythagorean corpus and on its later reception. Various topics (such as Orphism, Platonism, metempsychosis, eschatology, medicine, music, etc.) will be analyzed in different historical periods, from the Archaic Period (6th century BC) through the Middle Ages (including the Arabic tradition) to early Modernity (17th century AD).
